The biennial *Palliative Care in WA Awards* provides a unique opportunity to celebrate and showcase the professionalism, dedication, innovation and teamwork shown everyday by those who work in the palliative, aged care and community service sectors. The awards acknowledge the efforts of those professionals and volunteers who care for people who are at end-of-life and offer public recognition of individuals, teams and organisations who provide holistic and compassionate support and care in all settings across WA.

Awards

- Outstanding Palliative Care Professional

Eligibility, entry criteria and information

- Awards are only open to individuals, teams and organisations operating within WA.
- Individuals may self-nominate.
- All individuals, teams and organisations must consent to being nominated.
- Settings for the delivery of palliative care include homes, hospice, hospital, aged care and community.
- Entry is free.
- Nominations must be received by close of business on the closing date and on the prescribed form developed by Palliative Care WA.
- All finalists and winners consent to their image and information being used in publicity opportunities including advertising features, social media, print, digital platforms, TV and interviews.
- All nominations and supporting material will remain the property of PCWA and will not be returned.

Nomination process

- All nominations are confidential.
- Nominations are to be completed on the official Award Nomination Form and submitted online to awards@palliativecarewa.asn.au.
- Receipt of all nominations will be acknowledged by email within 24 hours of submission (please follow up with urgency if this is not received).

Selection Criteria

How has the individual, team or organisation:

1. Demonstrated excellence in the delivery of holistic palliative care and/or a compassionate community approach?
2. Respectfully engaged with clients from Aboriginal and culturally diverse communities?
3. Explored innovative approaches to delivering holistic palliative care and/or implementing a compassionate communities approach?
4. Partnered and/or collaborated with individuals, teams, organisations and communities in the pursuit of holistic palliative care and/or a compassionate communities approach?

Finalists

- Three finalists will be chosen for each category and they and their nominees will be advised on **Thursday 14 September**.
- These individuals, teams and organisations will be invited to provide additional information to support their nomination, including referee reports, client/community testimonials and other relevant material.
- This additional material will need to be submitted to Palliative Care WA by **Thursday 28 September** for consideration by the judging panel.
- Finalists will be permitted to submit **only** one piece of evidence per selection criteria.
- Evidence can be provided as written (maximum 250 words) or on video (maximum 3 minutes).

Judging

- A judging panel, comprising representatives from health consumer, palliative care, aged care and disability services will determine the finalists and winners in each category and their decision will be final with no appeal process.
- All attempts will be undertaken to manage any potential conflict of interest.
- The judging panel will have complete discretion and may call for additional information or clarification from nominees if required.
