External:

- Facilitate the CEO Roundtable on Palliative Care and either lead and/or contribute to a range of other forums or events to influence discussion, develop policy and inform State and Federal Government on palliative care issues e.g. Impact Labs with the UWA Centre for Social Impact and the Parliamentary Friends of Palliative Care
- Deliver an event(s) to showcase WA palliative care expertise and engage with both professional and community audiences
- Facilitate the Advance Care Planning Consortium to progress community-wide awareness of Advance Care Planning

Quality nalliative care for all

- Further develop and deliver a model to encourage the uptake of Advance Care Planning (ACP) in metro and rural communities across WA
- · Work with stakeholders to progress the funding and implementation of a Compassionate Communities approach in WA
- Coordinate activities to maximise engagement with Advance Care Planning Week (April), National Palliative Care Week (May) and Dying to Know Day (August)
- Review and reprint the *Palliative Caring* publication and develop a associated training program focused on the needs of families and carers
- Collaborate with Palliative Care Australia and other State and Territory member organisations on initiatives and key issues of mutual relevance

Internal:

- Focus on the financial sustainability of PCWA
- Develop, implement and continuously review a membership development strategy
